- 6. We prepare YP to manage changes and transitions.
- 7. As an organisation we communicate clearly with all stakeholders
- 8. We have bespoke pathways and integrate a YP's interests.
- 9. We have a bespoke Resilience Curriculum to reduce vulnerabilities.
- We provide environmental support, the systematic use of explicit visual and/or social cues to clarify meaning
